PERSONNEL AND ADMINISTRATIVE REFORMS (FR. IV) DEPARTMENT Dated: 25/3/99 G.O.Ms. No. 40 ORDER: As per Fundamental Rule 49, the maximum period up to which additional charge arrangement can be made for a post is only five months. Further, the maximum period for allowing additional pay for holding full additional charge is also five months. 2. Often doubts have been raised in regard to continuance of additional charge arrangement beyond five months and allowing additional pay for holding additional charge beyond the period of five months. Hence, a review of existing rule 49 of the Fundamental Rules has been made. After detailed examination, it has been decaded to deleto sub-clauses (iv) and (v) of clause (1) of rule 49 of the Fundamental Rules, since these rules as they stand now lead to confusion while making additional charge arrangements. The Government have, therefore, decided to delete the sub-clauses (iv) and (v) of clause (1) of rule 49 of the Fundamental rules and also to modify sub-clause (iii) in such a way that the payment of additional pay for holding full additional charge of a post should not exceed the period of five months. 3. The following Notification will be published in the Tamil Nadu Government Gazette: -NOTIFICATION

In exercise of the powers conferred by the provise to Article 309 read with Article 313, of the Constitution of India and all other powers hereunto enabling, the Governor of Tamil Nadu hereby makes the following amendments to the Fundamental Rules.

2. The amendments hereby made shall come into force on the 25th March 1999.

"Additional pay shall not be paid for the period
of holding full additional charge in excess of five

2) Sub-clauses (iv) and (v) shall be omitted.
