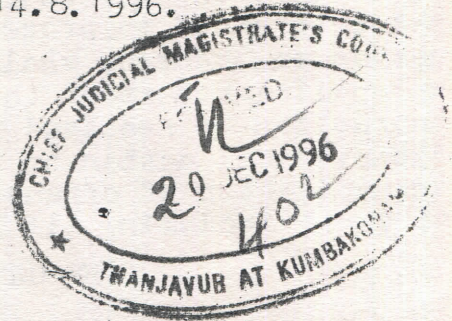

ORDER

In Government Memo No.568/62-1 Public (Ser-D) dated 17.11.62, it had been ordered that when once, a case has been entrusted to Directorate of Vigilance and Anti Corruption, for enquiry and report, there should be no parallel enquiry by the department Authorities. However, there could be cases of contraventions of Business Rules and Committal of procedural irregularities by Government servants, warranting initiation of departmental action immediately. In such cases, it would not be proper to stop parallel departmental enquiry. As such, the Government direct that, in cases of exceptional administrative exigency, even if the Director of Vigilance and Anti Corruption has been asked to take up and proceed

with enquiry into allegations for the purpose of looking into acts of corruption of Government servants, including All India Service Officers, it is open to the Government or the departmental authority to look into or conduct enquiries against them to find out whether there have been contraventions of Business Rules or other procedural irregularities, as the case may be, and issue charge Letter. However, where in respect of the same set of issues, the Director of Vigilance and Anti Corruption has been asked to proceed with the enquiries, the departmental action so ordered, shall be kept pending till the investigation or enquiry report of the Director of Vigilance and Anti Corruption is received with recommendation either for departmental action or for taking up a regular criminal case for investigation of offences found committed by the Government servants including All India Service Officers and others.
