Pension - Payment of family pension to the parents and widowed / divorced daughters of the State Government servants - Orders - Issued.

ORDER:

Based on the recommendations of the Vth Central Pay Commission, the Government of India have issued orders in the references read above sanctioning family pension to the parents and widowed / divorced daughters of the Central Government ^{servants} subject to the following conditions:

- (i). For the purpose of grant of family pension the definition of 'Family' shall also include.

(a) Parents who were wholly dependant on the Government servant when he/she was alive provided the deceased employee had left behind neither a widow / widower nor a child.

(b) son / daughter including widowed/divorced daughter till he/she attains the age of 25 years or up to the date of his/her marriage/ remarriage whichever is earlier.

(ii) The income criteria in respect of the parents and widowed/divorced daughters will be Rs.2,550/- per month. The family pension will be at 30% of basic pay of the deceased employees subject to a minimum of Rs.1,275/- per month. They also will have to produce an annual certificate to the effect that their earning is not more than Rs.2,550/- per month. Further, the family pension to the widowed/divorced daughters will be admissible till they attain the age of 25 years or upto the date of her re-marriage whichever is earlier.

(iii) The family pension in respect of sons/daughters including widowed/ divorced daughters will be admissible subject to the condition that the payment should be discontinued/ not admissible when the eligible son/daughter starts earning a sum of Rs.2,250/- p.m. from employment in Government, the private sector, self-employment, etc.,

2. The Government after careful examination have decided to adopt the above orders of Government of India in respect of the State Government Servants. Accordingly, the Government issue the following orders:

Family pension shall be sanctioned to the parents and widowed / divorced daughters subject to the following conditions:

(i) The parents were wholly dependant on the Government servant when he/she was alive

(ii) The Government servant has not left behind a widow/widower, eligible son or

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daughter, or a widowed / divorced daughter who will have a prior claim to family pension in the order indicated.

- (iii) The income criteria in respect of the parents and widowed/ divorced daughters will be Rs.2,550/- per month. The family pension shall be at 30% of basic pay of the deceased Government servant subject to a minimum of Rs.1,275/- per month. They will also produce an annual certificate to the effect that their earning is not more than Rs.2,550/- per month.

3. The Government also direct that in the case of sons/daughters including widowed/ divorced daughters, family pension shall be sanctioned till he/ she attains the age of 25 years or up to the date of his/her marriage / re-marriage whichever is earlier. The family pension in respect of sons/ daughters including widowed/ divorced daughters shall be discontinued / not admissible when the eligible son/ daughter starts earning a sum of Rs. 2,550/- from employment in State or Central Government or Government undertaking or Corporation or Autonomous Body or local fund or private employment or self-employment etc.

4. These orders shall take effect from the date of issue, past cases already settled need not be re-opened. The existing family pensioners shall be permitted to draw family pension irrespective of the income criteria, as and when the turn of next eligible person comes up for payment of family pension, the income limit as prescribed in the G.O. shall be applied.

5. Necessary amendment to the Tamil Nadu Pension Rules, 1978 will be issued separately.
