Sub: Medical claim - Admissibility of "BRICAVE MEST Admissible for the purpose of reimbursement of medical claim - Orders issued.

Ref: From the Director of Medical Education, Chermet-Letter Ref. No. 73265/A2/2/93, Dt. 23. 10.96.

The Director of Medical Education in his letter cated has stated that the inhaler "ERICANYL-MISTHALER" and "Asthalia Inhaler" facilitate administration of the smallest amount drugs without side effect to Bronchiat-Asthama patients who suffer for the disease lifelong. The side effect of the drugs which may on with oral administration will be minimised very much by using inhalers. It may be necessary for the patients to use these inhaler sometimes daily depending upon the state of diseases. The inhaler is not an apparating or an instrument and they contain sufficient doses of medicine in Vapourised form. They are carried in the pockets often by Asthamatic patients. The inhalers are essential for the treatment of Bronchial Asthma, which is aChronic debilitating disease. He has therefore requested the Government to issue orders that the cost of "Bricanyl Misthaler" may be treated as admissible for the purpose of reimbursement of medical claim.

2. The Government after careful examination accept the recommendation of the Director of Medical Education and hereby direct that the cost of "Bricanyl Misthaler" may be treated as admissible for the purpose of reimbursement of medical claim. Necessary corrections may be made in the list of inadmissible medicines.

3. This letter issues with the concurrence of Finance Department vide its U.O.No.98754/Sal.96-1, Dt. 12.12.1996.
