Sub: Personnel - Surrender of Residential Office Assistants in lieu of cash allowance - Tamil Nadu Servants Allowance Scheme, 1960 - Recommendation of the Fifth Pay Commission - Implementation orders issued - Amendment - Issued.

I am directed to state that in G.O.Ms.No.47, Personnel and Administrative Reforms Department, dated 9.2.1993 among others, it has been ordered in para 2 (a) that

iv) Deputy Secretaries, District Revenue Officers, Under Secretaries, Executive Engineer and others in the pay range of Rs.3000-4500 and who are presently entitled for a residential Office Assistant.

(to be compulsorily surrendered in lieu of cash allowance for new incumbents to these posts after 1.3.93)

v) All others who are below the pay scale of Rs.3000-4500 but are entitled for a Residential Office Assistant by a Specific order.

(to be compulsorily surrendered in lieu of cash allowance. This facility to this category will be given only to the existing incumbent as on 1.3.93 and once he vacates the post, his successor will not be entitled to this facility. It will not be available to those appointed or promoted after 1.3.93)


2. In the above said Government Order in para 2 (b), it has been stated that 'the Officers who are entitled to two residential Office Assistants under items (i) and (ii) in (a) above can surrender both the Office Assistants if they so desire. In respect of Officers mentioned in item (iii) in the statement in para 2 (a) above, they should surrender one Office Assistant compulsorily and the other at their option. In respect of categories under (iv) and (v) in para (a) above, the surrender of the Office Assistant is compulsory in respect of new incumbents after 1.3.93.'

3. In respect of the Officers mentioned in item (iv) under para 2 (a), of the Government Order cited, it has been ordered that the Residential Office Assistant, should be surrendered compulsorily for payment of cash allowance, for new incumbents after 1.3.93. In respect of Officers mentioned in item (v) under para 2 (a), of the Government Order cited, it has been ordered that the surrender of Residential Office Assistant is compulsory but this facility will not be available to those appointed or promoted after 1.3.1993. However, in para 2 (b), of the Government Order cited, it has been mentioned that in respect of categories under (iv) and (v) in para 2 (a) the surrender of Office Assistant is compulsory in respect of new incumbents after 1.3.93. This provision is actually meant for item (iv) only. Hence, the following amendment is issued to G.O.Ms. No.47, Personnel and Administrative Reforms Department dated 9.2.93. The amendment hereby made shall take effect on and from 9.2.93.

AMENDMENT

In the said order, the expression "and (v)" occurring in para 2 (b) shall be deleted.
