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Abstract: Primary Health Centres - Part II Scheme for 1984-85
Opening of 10 Additional Primary Health Centres in the Blocks
Orders issued

Read: From the Director of Primary Health Centres Lr.
R.No.121788/PHCs, 2/31/83 at 12.11.83 & 8.84 and
24.8.84.

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As per the Alma Ata Declaration to which India is a signatory, a large number of Primary Health Centres have to be established, to meet the requirements of the increased population by 2000 A.D. Taking the population growth into consideration, Tamil Nadu needs 740 Primary Health Centres by 2000 A.D. Additional Primary Health Centres have to be opened in the Panchayat Union areas in a phased manner, to achieve the object of one Primary Health Centre for every 30,000 population by 2000 A.D. During the VIth Plan Period it is proposed to establish 80 Additional Primary Health Centres in the State. Of these 20 Primary Health Centres in General and 2 Primary Health Centres under Hill Area Development Programme during 1981-82 and 2 Primary Health Centres in Pudukottai District during 1982-83 have been sanctioned. During 1983-84, 17 Additional Primary Health Centres were established. For the year 1984-85, the Government have decided to establish 10 Additional Primary Health Centres in this State.

2. The Government after careful consideration of the proposals submitted by the Director of Primary Health Centres in this regard, direct that 10 Additional Primary Health Centres be established at the places mentioned in Annexure I to this order.

3. Sanction is also accorded for the creation of staff mentioned in the annexure II to this order for each Primary Health Centre on the scale of pay noted against each staff from the date of appointment for a period upto 28.2.85. The staff in addition to their pay is eligible for Dearness Allowance, House Rent Allowance and other allowances such as Fixed Travelling Allowance and restricted Private practice Allowance as per the rules in force from time to time.

4. The Government also sanction the incurring of a non-recurring expenditure of Rs.6.25 lakhs (Rupees six lakhs and twenty five thousand only) towards the purchase of materials furnitures, linen, equipment and other hospital necessaries other than jeeps.

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5. The Director of Primary Health Centres is requested to send necessary proposals separately with plans and estimates for the construction of buildings for 10 Additional Primary Health Centres sanctioned in para 2 above. Meanwhile necessary arrangements should be made to make the Primary Health Centres function in rented buildings.

6. The expenditure should be debited to "280 Medical - A. Allopathy - AB. Medical Relief - Schemes in the Sixth Five Year Plan - II State Plan - JM - Primary Health Centres" (D.P. Code No. 280A ABJM 0007).
