ORDER:

The Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India in their letter first read above have stated that 30 Primary Health Centres in Tamilnadu State have been identified for being supported under National Programme for Control of Blindness on a 100% centrally financed basis during 1984-85. They have also requested this Government to furnish the names of the 30 Primary Health Centres with reference to above. The Ministry of Health and Family Welfare Government of India have also stated that the financial assistance provided for strengthening the Primary Health Centres to provide eye care service is as follows:

- (i) One time assistance for equipment worth Rs.3000/- per Primary Health Centre. (Imported equipments worth Rs.1750/- per Primary Health Centre will be provided by the Central Government and Equipment worth Rs.1250/- have to be purchased by the State Government)

- (ii) Recurring assistance Rs.13000/- p.a. for salary of one Ophthalmic Assistant.

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2. The Director of Primary Health Centres in her letter second read above furnished a list of names of 30 Primary Centres and certain other proposals regarding the enhancement of central assistance for the post of Ophthalmic Assistant etc. getting the concurrence of the Government of India. In Govt. letter third above, the proposal of the Director of Primary Health Centres, was forwarded to the Government of India for approval. In the meantime, the Director of Primary Health in her letter fourth read above has stated that the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India have supplied the following equipments to the 30 Primary Health Centres.

1. Ophthalmoscope
2. Tonometer

The Director of Primary Health Centres has further stated that the equipments supplied by the Government of India were distributed to the 30 Primary Health Centre in anticipation of the orders of the Government. The Director of Primary Health Centres has requested that orders may be issued for purchase of equipments worth Rs. 1250/- to be purchased by the State Government. The Director of Primary Health Centres has also requested the Government to accord sanction for 30 posts of Ophthalmic Assistant to 30 Primary Health Centres.

3. The Government after careful examination accord sanction to the following:-

(i) Sanction is accorded for identification of 30 Primary Health Centres under National Programme for Control of Blindness as mentioned in the Annexure I to this order.

(ii) Sanction is accorded for creation of one post of Ophthalmic Assistant in the scale of pay of Rs. 705-1230 temporarily for a period upto 29-2-1983 to each of the 30 Primary Health Centres mentioned in the Annexure I to this order.

(iii) Sanction is accorded for purchase of equipments worth Rs. 1250/- as detailed in the Annexure II to this order to be purchased by the State Government.

4. The Government ratify the action of the Director of Primary Health Centres in having distributed the equipment supplied by the Government of India to the 30 Primary Health Centres.

5. The holders of the post sanctioned in para 3 above shall be eligible draw pay in addition to Dearness Allowance, House Rent Allowance, City Compensatory Allowance

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end other allowances if any at the rates admissible from time to time under the rules in force.

6. The Director of Primary Health Centres is requested to take immediate action to fill up the posts sanctioned above. The Director of Primary Health Centre is also requested to take action for claiming the reimbursement in full for the recurring and non-recurring expenditure sanctioned above from the Government of India.

7. The expenditure shall be debited to the head of account "282 Public Health Sanitation and Water supply - A. Public Health and Sanitation - AB. Prevention and control of Diseases - Schemes in the Seventh Five Year Plan III Centrally sponsored SJ. Prevention and control of blindness (BP Code. No.282 ABSJ 0008).
