Upgraded Primary Health Centres -Strengthening of 106 Upgraded Primary Health Centres - Sanction of additional staff of Medical Officers including Specialist Doctors and Paramedical Staff – Provision of equipments and Hospital accessories, etc., - Orders - Issued.

ORDER:

During the years 2001-05, 106 Primary Health Centres were upgraded as 30 bedded Primary Health Centres from the PMGY funds, NABARD loan and State funds. These Upgraded Primary Health Centres were not sanctioned adequate staff. Some Upgraded Primary Health Centres were not sanctioned some Medical equipments, Hospital accessories etc.

2. The Director of Public Health and Preventive Medicine has sent proposals for sanctioning of additional staff of Doctors and Para-Medical staff to these Upgraded Primary Health Centres and for the sanction of non-recurring expenditure towards purchase of Medical equipments, hospital accessories etc.

3. The Hon'ble Minister for Health has also announced in the Assembly while moving the Health Demand for the year 2006-2007 that all the Upgraded Primary Health Centres will be strengthened by appointing Specialists Doctors.

4. The Director of Public Health and Preventive Medicine has further stated that due to non-availability of 24 hours services in the upgraded Primary Health Centres, utilization of inpatient facilities is poor. If these upgraded Primary Health Centres are declared as Medico Legal Centres, then there would be pressure from the public on the doctors to stay in the Primary Health Centres round the clock. 5 Doctors are essential in the upgraded Primary Health Centres to provide round the clock services and to declare them as Medico Legal Centres. In all these Upgraded Primary Health Centres, one Obstetrics and Gynaecology Specialist may be posted. There is no sufficient Anaesthetists for appointment in the upgraded Primary Health Centres. Under Reproductive and Child Health Project, Anaesthetists training for 6 months is being given to the MBBS Doctors and these trained Doctors may be posted in the upgraded Primary Health Centres to attend the delivery cases and minor operations.

5. The Government have examined the proposals of Director of Public Health and Preventive Medicine in greater detail and fix the following staffing pattern to the Upgraded Primary Health Centres:-

Of the five posts of Medical Officer, two posts shall be earmarked, one for a obstetrician and another for anaesthetist / trained anaesthetist. The remaining three will be MBBS graduates. If the anaesthetist is not available, the services of hired anaesthetist will be used with the post being kept vacant.

6. With a view to fulfill the staffing pattern approved in paragraph 5 above, the Government accept the proposals of Director of Public Health and Preventive Medicine and accord sanction for creation of the following number of additional posts in the time scale of pay to the 106 Upgraded Primary Health Centres initially for a period of one year from the date of issue of this order or from the date of filling up of the posts whichever is earlier:-

7. Sanction is also accorded for the Recurring Expenditure for Rs.6.63 crores (Rupees Six crores and sixtythree lakhs only) approximately towards creation of posts as detailed in Annexure -I

8. Sanction is also accorded for a non-recurring expenditure of Rs. 4.94 crores (Rupees four crores and ninety four lakhs only) towards purchase of equipments, linen & mattresses, furniture, Boyle's apparatus, etc., for the 106 Upgraded Primary Health Centres as detailed in the Annexure -II

9. The expenditure sanctioned in paragraph 7 and 8 above shall be debited to the following Head of Account.

10. The Government also declare these 106 upgraded Primary Health Centres as Medico-legal Centres in which round the clock first aid services would be provided for the injuries, accidents etc.

11. The expenditure sanctioned in paragraphs 7 and 8 above shall constitute an item of New Instrument of Service for which approval of the Legislature will be obtained in due course. Pending approval of Legislature, the expenditure shall be met initially by an advance from the contingency fund order regarding which will be issued by Finance (BGI) Department based on the application from the Director of Public Health and Preventive Medicine in the prescribed form along with a copy of this order. The Director of Public Health and Preventive Medicine is directed to send draft explanatory note for inclusion of the above expenditure in the Supplementary Estimates 2007-08 to obtain approval of the legislature at the appropriate time.

12. This order issues with the concurrence of Finance Department vide its U.O. No.27799 / Health / 2007-1, dated 07.05.2007 and 30128 / CMPC / 2007-1, dated 14.05.2007 and Additional Sanction Ledger No. 106 (One hundred and six).



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

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
